





## Tarbiyah curriculum framework feedback forms


A total of 118 teachers worldwide completed and submitted the feedback forms

Age of respondents




No. of respondents from each madrasah










Please provide proper training to all teachers before this curriculum is implemented

This curriculum is dynamic, exciting and very relevant. It addresses the needs of the student today. As a teacher I can't wait to implement this and see how the children respond.



