Dua after Subh prayers

Dua after Dhur prayers

- ❖ Bless us with wishes that are good for us

Dua after Asr prayers

- ❖ Seek refuge from
 - ❖ Unsatisfied souls
 - ❖ Non fearing hearts
 - ❖ Non benefiting knowledge
 - ❖ Unanswered prayers
 - ❖ Give us ease after difficulty

Duas after Maghrib prayers

- ❖ Give us success (heaven)
- ❖ Safety from fire
- ❖ Nearness of Ahlul Bait (as)

- ❖ We have no blessings but from You (we are what You have made us)
- ❖ We turn to you

Dua after Isha prayers

- ❖ We have no knowledge of our livelihood
- ❖ We have searched all over
- ❖ You know where it can be acquired
- ❖ Make it easy for us
- ❖ Send blessings on Ahlul Bait (as)
- ❖ You are too generous to punish us
- ❖ Your Grace is Great
