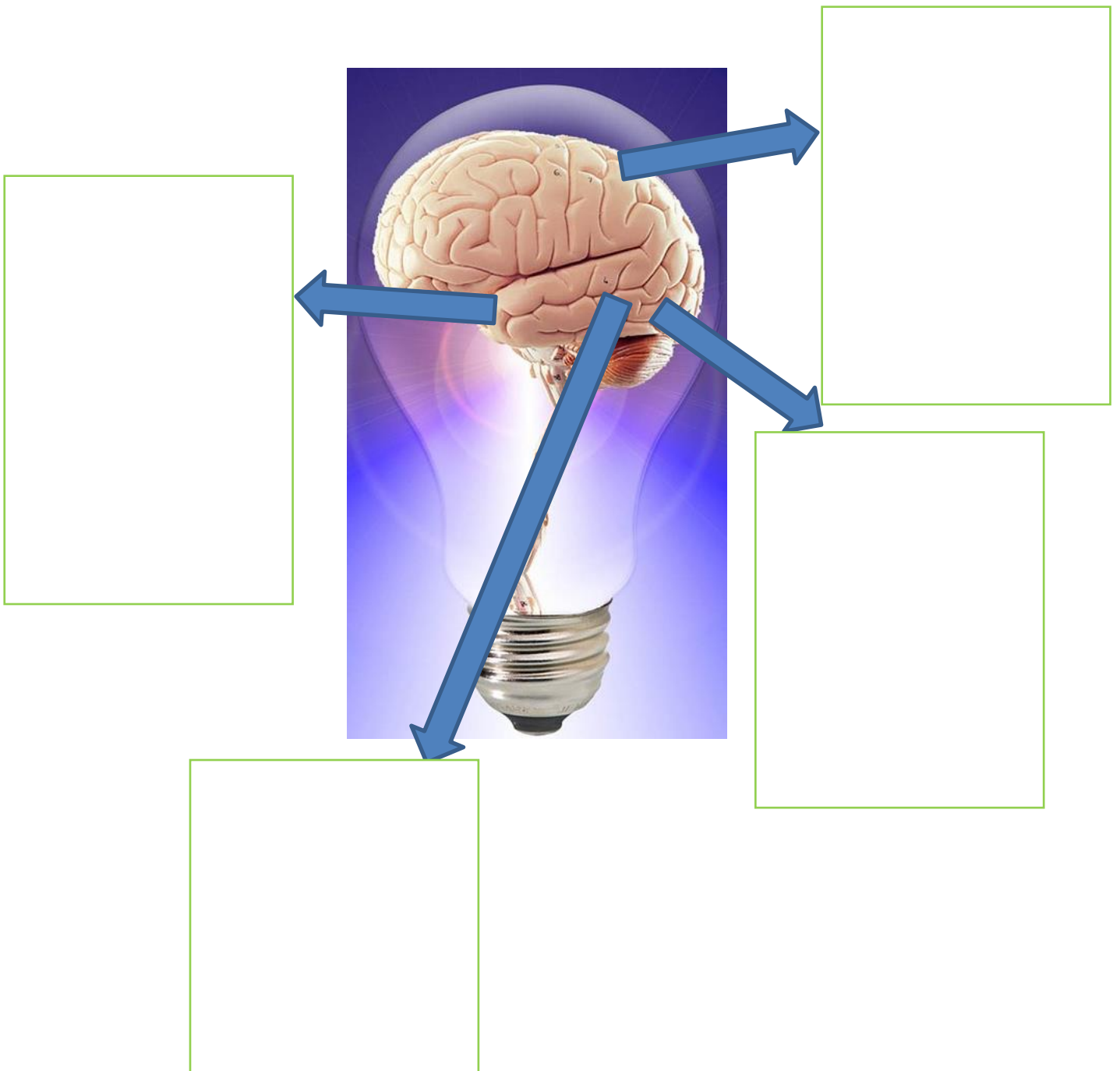

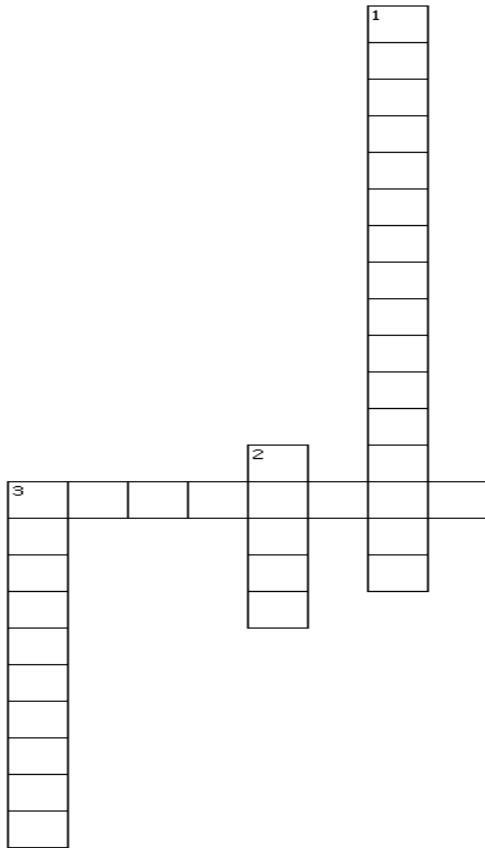
### Brain Power Test
